This section includes location maps and the Site Gazetteer based on the findings of that fieldwork.


The layout of the report is self-explanatory; the site location maps (10 figures in total) precede the printout of the Site Gazetteer on page 13


The location maps use the 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition Ordnance Survey maps of 1905 as background data as supplied by the RCAHMW for the use of the project

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
The Site Gazetteer itself is a copy of the information provided in the project database created for the project and submitted to the RCAHMW in digital format

3. An earthen round barrow, 16m in diameter and 1.3m high, situated in a saddle between Little Hill and Llyn y Waun. A smaller mound, NPRN 289361, approximately 20m to the north, has formerly been interpreted as natural, a possible round barrow or a possible gibbet mound.
