
Eglwys Sant Silyn yw un o'r gwyraf o eglwysi trefi Cymru o ddiwedd yr Oesoedd Canol. Fe'i hailgodwyd mewn arddull Berpendicwlar ysblennydd ar ôl tân difrifol tua diwedd y bymthegfed ganrif. Mae to'r canol yn drawiadol dros ben ac ystyrid y tŵr yn un o Saith Rhyfeddod Cymru.

St Giles's is one of the finest late-medieval town churches in Wales. It was rebuilt in a lavish Perpendicular style following a serious fire in the late fifteenth century. The nave roof is spectacular and the tower was regarded as one of the Seven Wonders of North Wales.
