

Ardal y Farchnad yn Ninbych

Denbigh's Market Area

O ddechrau'r unfed ganrif ar bymtheg, dechreuodd ardal y farchnad ganoloesol grebachu wrth i ynys drionglog o adeiladau gael ei chodi rhwng y Stryd Fawr a Lôn Gefn. Roedd masnach wedi datblygu erbyn y ganrif honno, pan oedd Dinbych yn adnabyddus am ei sidanwyr, menigwyr, gwehyddion a chryddion. Ym 1833 nododd Samuel Lewis fod saith mil o barau o fenig yn cael eu hanfon i Lundain bob blwyddyn a bod trin lledr yn parhau'n ddiwydiant pwysig.

The island triangle of buildings between High Street and Back Row gradually encroached upon the medieval market area from the early sixteenth century onwards. Trade had developed by the sixteenth century and Denbigh was renowned for its mercers, glovers, weavers and shoemakers. In 1833, Samuel Lewis noted that 'about seven thousand dozen pair of gloves were annually sent to London, Bristol, and other places', and that tanning was an important industry.
