AIRCRAFT 42-31321 TOOK OFF FROM CASABLANCA ON 8 JULY 1944, DESTINATION ST. MAWGAN FIELD AT LANDS END, ENGLAND. DUE TO POOR NAVIGATION AND WIND CHANGE, THE SHIP WAS 100 MILES OFF COURSE WHEN IT REACHED THE TSLES AND CHANGE, THE SHIP WAS TOO MILES OFF COORSE WHEN IT REAGED THE TOLL OF REAGED THE SHIPTWAS OVER CAME IN OVER SOUTH WALES. GAS WAS VERY LOW AND AS THE SHIPTWAS OVER MOUNTAINOUS TERRAIN, THEY CIRCLED THE FIRST FIELD AVAILABLE JNLAND, WHICH WAS A GRASS R.A.F. FIELD AT MERIONITHSHIRE, NORTH WALES. THE FIELD WAS ONLY 1800 FEET LONG, UNFIT FOR HEAVY AIRCRET, AND ALTHOUGH THE LANDING WAS ACCOMPLISHED, THE AIRCRAFT ROLL CARRIED IT OFF THE END OF THE FIELD OVER A RAILROAD TRACK AND ON TOP OF AN AIR RAID SHELTER. DAMAGE WAS EXTENSIVE, DESTROYING THE # 3 ENGINE AND WIND. THE AIRPLANE WAS SALVAGED. NO ONE WAS INJURED, BUT IT IS CLAIMED DAMAGE WAS DONE TO THE RAILROAD TRACK.

### 6 ERILELCATE

- 1. ON A FLIGHT, 8 JULY 1944, FROM CASABLANCA TO ST. MAWGAN FIELD AT LAND END ENGLAND, WE BECAME LOST AND WOUND UP IN SOUTHERN WALES. I STARTED SEARCHING FOR AN ALTERNATE FIELD, BUT WAS IN MOUNTAINOUS TERRATN AND COULD NOT LOCATE ONE. THE NAVIGATOR STILL THOUGHT WE WERE ON THE PENINSULA, KNOWN AS LANDS END AND THE FIELDS WE LOOKED FOR WERE NOT TO BE FOUND.
- 2. WITH THE GAS GAUGES READING ALMOST EMPTY, I CAME UPON A SMALL RAF FIELD. IT WAS A GRASS FIELD, 1800 FEET LOND. I SENT THE CREW INTO THE RADIO ROOM TO PREPARE FOR DITCHING. I LANDED THE SHIP AND IMMEDIATELY APPLIED BRAKES WHICH WOULD NOT HOLD ON THE GRASS. I THEN HAD THE CO-PILOT UNLOCK THE TAIL WHEEL AND TRIED TO GROUND-LOOF, BUT THE GRASS WOULD ONLY LET US SLIDE.
- FOR A CONCRETE GUN EMPLACEMENT AND MISSED IT. THE SHIP WENT UP OVER A RAILROAD TRACK AT THE END OF THE FIELD AND LANDED ON TOP OF AN AIR RAID SHELTER.
  - THE RAF THOUGHT WE HAD BOMES ON BOARD AND DID NOT SEND A FIRE TRUCK. I RAN OVER TO THE HEADQUARTERS AND CALLED FOR A FIRE TRUCK, ASSURING THEM THAT IT WAS SAFE FOR THEM TO COME. THEY EVENTUALLY PUT OUT THE FIRE.
  - 5. THE DAMAGE WAS #3 ENGINE DESTROYED, INNER WING PANEL DESTROYED, TWO FLAT TIRES, FUSELAGE SLIGHTLY DAMAGED, AND \*PROPS BENT, CHINGTURRET DAMAGED. THE SHIP WAS STRIPPED OF ALL ACCESSORIES WHICH WE BROUGHT BACK TO THE FIELD.

6. NO ONE WAS INJURED. NO CIVILIAN PROPERTY DAMAGED.

#### CERTLELCATE

WE WERE FOLLOWING OUR RADIO COMPASS, LOOKING FOR OUR FIELD.
WE NOTICED WE WERE IN THE COUNTAINS AND OUT GAS WAS VERY LOW, SO
WE LOOKED FOR A FIELD TO LAND. WE KEPT TRANSFERRING GAS TO KEEP
OUT ENGINES RUNNING. WE FINALLY SAW AN RAF FIELD AND DECIDED TO
CHANCE A LANDING THERE, RATHER THAN CRASHING IN THE MOUNTAINS.
WE CAME IN ON A NORMAL APPROACH, AND HIT IN THE FIRST THIRD OF THE
RUNWAY. THE BRAKES WERE APPLIED, BUT THE FIELD WAS GRASS AND WE
SLID ALONG JUST AS FAST. I UNLOCKED THE TAIL WHEEL TO GROUND-LOOP
IT, BUT IT ONLY SLID SIDE-WAYS. AS WE CAME TO THE END OF THE FIELD,
A GUN EMPLACEMENT LOOMED UP AND WE JUST GOT IT STRAIGHTENED IN TIME
TO WISS IT. WE HIT A RAILROAD TRACK AND LANDED ON THE TOP OF AN
AIR-RAID SHELTER. WE HAD RIPPED #3 ENGINE OFF AND IT BUCKLED UNDER
THE WING, PIERCING THE OIL TANK, AND AN OIL FIRE RESULTED. THERE
WAS NO GAS IN THE TANK, BECAUSE IT JUST FOLDED AND DID NT EVEN BURN.
WE DITCHED THE AIRPLANE WITHOUT ANYONE BEING HURT. THE GAS TANKS
WERE CHECKED AFTER THE FIRE WAS PUT OUT, AND THERE WAS NO GAS IN
ANY OF THE TANKS.
