
Tymawr Farm

- 1) Within the 20m by 20m survey area there is a broad area of high resistance (A) which would suggest the presence of stone/building material. Within this band there are discrete areas of higher resistance (B) which may be significant. There is no suggestion of walls although this does not rule out the possibility of them being present. If there is a lot of rubble spread across the site it would not be possible to 'see' or detect individual walls. Alternatively it is possible that the areas of higher resistance indicate stone floors.
- 2) The area of high resistance (C) may be of interest.
- 3) There are suggestions of a rectilinear high resistance anomaly (D) which may represent a wall, but it is a very weak anomaly. However it could be associated with the floor you found when building your new toilet.






Tymanok - "Manor House" lesistance Data




